# ACTIVITIES OF THE MONTH


## UNIQUE TALENT SHOW (UTS) – 3RD EDITION

## FIELD TRIP TO GANDHI KRUSHI VIGYANA KENDRA

On 29th January 2026, students of Grades IV to VIII stepped into an engaging learning experience at Gandhi Krushi Vigyana Kendra (GKVK). Students discovered the role of various insects and flies in agriculture and the ecosystem, while also learning about GKVK's establishment and purpose as a leading research and learning centre.

A walk through the GKVK Museum revealed early shops and market systems, offering a glimpse into life from earlier times and making the trip both insightful and engaging. Students also visited the Agricultural Museum, where the displays further enriched their understanding of farming practices, tools, and agricultural heritage.

## Experiential learning @ Embassy Academy

Classrooms at Embassy Academy are action zones as students learn by doing, creating, exploring, and experimenting. Early learners discovered multiplication with cubes and repeated addition, enjoyed Lego builds, pounding activities, and strengthened language skills through vowels, consonants, CVC words, and bead shapes.

Across levels, concepts came alive through water cycle models, cylinder exploration, string math projects, and the imaginative 'Measurement Park'. Students spotted simple machines around campus and conducted exciting volcano eruption experiments.

Creativity thrived through kite-making, rhymes, dance club, value education, and STEM model making. Upper grades mapped 'The Judiciary', explored knitting, and decoded parallel lines through design thinking, while the Eco Club nature walk and GVKK field trip extended learning beyond the classroom, showing that learning at Embassy Academy is truly experienced, not just taught.
